“LEARNING WHAT MAKES PRAYER POWERFUL”

I. The great scientist Max Planck, considered to be the father of quantum theory, once wrote: *“All matter originates and exists only by virtue of a force which brings the particles of an atom to vibration and holds this most minute solar system of the atom together..... We must assume behind this force the existence of a conscious and intelligent mind. The mind is the matrix of matter.”*

A. As a Christian I believe Father God to be the matrix of all matter and that He is our Source.

1. As a Christian I draw from the Source (GOD) through prayer, and as a minister I am alarmed at the number of Christians today that have lost their faith in prayer.
2. This compels me to teach the truth as I see it. Why? In order to reinforce the importance of prayer in the Christians life.
3. In my studies I have found many ancient traditions that reveal that the positive effects of prayer comes from something else other than the words of the prayer.
 - a. This principle of prayers of words only reinforces the reason many Christians today are losing their faith in prayer.

- B. This brings me to ask, have we lost the proper method or mode of prayer?
1. I personally believe that it was after the edits of the fourth century when the text of many books were altered or eliminated in the selection of what would go into our Bible.
 2. In the study of Church history I found that it was at this time when the language of prayer gradually faded from the traditions of the West, leaving only empty words behind.
 3. Without a doubt, the Christian Church changed its concepts concerning prayer so that the power of prayer lived only in spoken words.

4. Thank God, we in the Body of Christ are now learning the Lost Mode of Prayer.
 - a. We now are receiving revelations from the Spirit and from pre-fourth-century texts that are reminding us that there are no words with magic vowels and consonants that open the doorway to God.
 - b. An example of this is found in the Dead Sea Scrolls where we are invited to experience the intent of our prayers: **“Spoken only with the mouth, they are as a dead hive...which gives no more honey.”** (The Essene Gospel of Peace, Book 2)
5. The power of prayer is not in spoken words, it is in the feelings that the prayer’s words evoke with us that brings the manifestation.

“THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN EMOTIONS AND FEELINGS”

- C. This is a good place to ask the question, is there any difference between emotions and feelings?
1. Most of our modern dictionaries consider the two words nearly interchangeable, using each one to define the other.
 - a. In the American Heritage Dictionary the word feeling is defined as *“an emotional state or disposition; a tender emotion.”*
 - b. In the same text, emotion is defined in one place as *“a strong feeling”* and in another as a synonym for feeling.
 2. These definitions serve the purpose of today’s world because we don’t know any better.
 3. The ancient people clearly made a distinction between them. Why?
 4. Because the ancients identified *thought and feelings* as keys, which could be focused on to effect change in the conditions of their bodies, or their world.
 5. Speaking of the world; there is an account some twenty centuries old that tells of the people in Israel asking their elders a question that continues to ring in our minds today.
 - a. That question was, ***“How, then, may we bring peace to our***

brothers....for we would that all of the Sons of Men share in the blessings of the angel of peace.” (The Essene Gospel of peace, Book 4, 30)

- b. Its no surprise that the Essene masters replied in a way pointing them toward the role of thought, feeling, and the empowering nature of prayer toward God the Father.
6. These Elders knew that “peace” is more than simply the absence of aggression and war. This kind of thinking defies the logic of today.
 - a. God’s peace transcends the end of a conflict or a statement of policy.
 - b. As a strong people we may force the outward appearance of peace upon a people or a nation, but it will not last.
 - c. In order for peace to last the underlying thinking of people must be changed.
 - d. The Essene masters knew the answer: *“Three are the dwellings of the Son of Man...They are his body, his thoughts, and his feelings....First shall the Son of Man seek peace with his own thoughts.....then shall the Son of man seek peace with his own feelings.”* (Ibid., 30-31)

“THE KEY OF THE LOST MODE OF PRAYER”

- II. The Essene Elders offered eloquent insight into a way of thinking that allows us to redefine *what we experience on the outside by addressing what we have become on the inside.*
 - A. The Hebrew Essene Elders knew that mankind consisted of spirit, soul, and body.
 1. To them they saw this as: *“.....the dwellings of the Son of Man...They are his body, his thoughts, and his feelings.”*
 2. They also knew that: *First shall the Son of Man seek peace with his own thoughts.....then shall the Son of man seek peace with his own feelings.*
